## 1BB Assembly

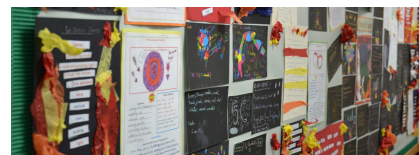

They have also been out and about around the school grounds looking at the striking colours of the autumn



leaves and using them as inspiration for further poetry of their own.

## Royal Society Book Club

The Royal Society Young People's Book Prize aims to promote literacy in young people and in particular to inspire them to read about Science. Each Thursday lunchtime, the St Faith's judging panel for The Royal Society Young People's Book Prize, meet to discuss their views on the latest titles which all have a scientific theme and are aimed at children aged 5-16 years. This year, more than 11,500 young judges, drawn from 537 schools, science centres, and community groups from across the UK, are reading the short list of books and providing their judgments, ahead of the winner being announced in February 2022. Our judging panel is made up of six Year 6 pupils, George, Harris, Molly, Juliette, Aashna and Patrick, who read the books in their own time and then meet over lunch to discuss their reflections. A final decision on which is their favourite book along with their review comments will be forwarded to The Royal Society. Our Head of Science, Mrs Price, was keen to congratulate all the participants for their outstanding commitment and enthusiasm stating, 'It is a pleasure to listen to their articulate, thoughtful and informed opinions.' ## IAPS Engineering Course

Yesterday our Head of Engineering, Dr Hoyle, hosted an 'Introduction to Engineering' course in conjunction with the Independent Association of Preparatory Schools (IAPS). In the past, these training events have allowed teachers from other IAPS schools to spend the day in our Engineering facilities, learning first-hand how to introduce Engineering to their curriculum, with a focus on developing problem solving skills alongside the types of hands-on work the pupils are able to enjoy. Necessarily, yesterday's event had to specially adapted, as 32 delegates from 30 schools joined Dr Hoyle remotely via Teams. However, Dr Hoyle devised a number of inventive 'desktop alternatives' to the activities that had been demonstrated in the Hub in previous years, and the delegates enjoyed attempting these remotely. Feedback from the event was hugely positive and I am very grateful to Dr Hoyle and our colleagues at IAPS for organising

and hosting this event.
