Those of you who have been in school recently and have eagle eyes may have noticed some curious happenings between the Keynes and Ashburton buildings. In place of the usual paving, there is a temporary cemented surface. Not very exciting you may be thinking. Well, this is just the beginning of the work that will transform this outdoor area in to a large indoor additional academic teaching and learning facility.

## STEAM HUB

Over the Easter break, a team of builders prepared the foundations, services and drainage for a new 'STEAM Hub', which will be constructed over the next two summer holidays (to avoid any disruption to the children's education). STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Design and Maths. A glass roof will enclose the current outdoor area between the buildings, the Science laboratories will be expanded and refitted, and additional teaching and learning space will be created. Crucially, the Hub will link the Science, Engineering, Computing, Art and Design and Maths Departments and will create a large indoor space for inter-disciplinary project work. By September 2017, the glass roof should have been fitted and the indoor space created. In the summer of 2018, the Science laboratories will be extended and refurbished and the STEAM Hub completed. To give you a taste of things to come, a 'walk through' film of this facility can be viewed here.



As you will see  from the film, the 'STEAM Hub' will have a roof top greenhouse for the children to grow and study plants and vegetables, something which the current children in the Foundation classes will be able to make good use in the future. In their assembly on Wednesday, Class F52 showed their parents and teachers that they have

already learnt much about plants, as you can see from the photograph below. Thank you to the children, Mrs Harmsworth and Mrs O'Hanlon for such an uplifting start to the day.

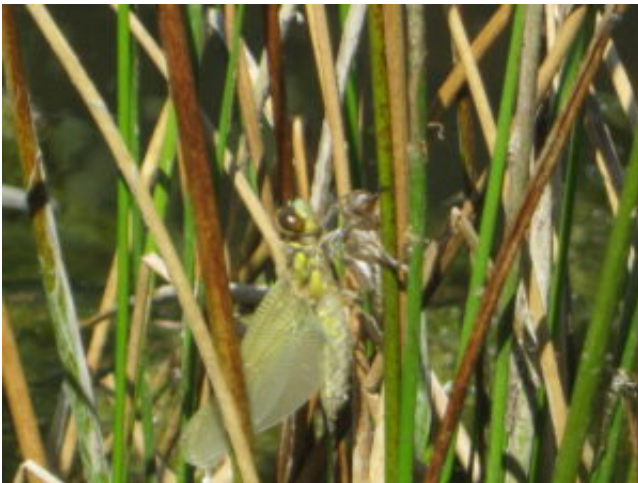
– a fantastic achievement.
