Start of Term Assembly

We began the term with a school assembly for pupils from Pre-Prep through to Year 8 in the Ashburton Hall. We considered the idea of New Year's Resolutions, as well as the theme of 'willpower', especially exploring the ways in which we might be able to build our willpower in the year ahead.

A short story of 'Frog and Toad', by Arnold Lobel, encouraged us to appreciate the ways in which making plans and seeing them through can help us in so many aspects of life. We closed our assembly with a prayer for the year ahead, inspired by Psalm 121.

PowerHouse Games

The term has begun with great energy, and this morning 12 of our Year 7 pupils have been visiting Cambridge University Sports Centre to take part in an event organised by Power2Inspire is to embed inclusive sport in the sporting, education and community landscapes. This organisation was established in 2013 by John Willis, who regularly visits St Faith's to talk to the pupils about inclusion in sport. John, a passionate sportsman, was born without fully formed arms and legs and he was determined that his experience as a child of being excluded from sports, should not be repeated. He therefore created the PowerHouseGames which offer children opportunities to experience a wide variety of specially adapted and inclusive sports.

Christmas Activities

On a similarly active theme, although the Michaelmas term ended on 16th December, a range of activities took place at school the week before Christmas. I am most grateful to those staff who ran the three day Multi-activity course as well as the Art and Design workshop for our Year 3-8 pupils. All the activities were greatly enjoyed by the children.

Year 5 started their fractions topic this week and have been solving a fractions jigsaw to consolidate previous work. They were required to combine their knowledge of fractions including equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions, addition and subtraction of simple fractions. The Year 5 pupils have worked very collaboratively and diligently since their return to school.
