Year 8 Reading Competition

It has been another busy and enriching week for our pupils. On Monday, all of Year 8 assembled in Ashburton Hall for the formal judging of our annual Reading Competition. The first rounds take place in each group's English lessons when every child has to choose from a selection of poems and is assessed by their peers as well as the teacher. Qualities which are sought after include enunciation, projection, pace and expression. The top four or five pupils from each class then go forward to the finals in which they need to read a poem from the finalists' selection and a prose passage of their own choice. Our judge for the session was Mrs Anna Divito, Head of English at The Leys.

This year, poems included *The Road not Taken* by Robert Frost, *The Charge of the Light Brigade* by Alfred Lord Tennyson, *Ozymandias* by Percy Bysshe Shelley, *Composed on Westminster Bridge* by Wordsworth and *Digging* by Seamus Heaney. Prose extracts came from authors as diverse as Sophie Kinsella and Charles Dickens!

Islanders Exhibition at The Fitzwilliam Museum

On Tuesday afternoon the Year 8 Art & Design Group visited the 'Islanders' Exhibition at Fitzwilliam Museum. The trip provided the pupils with the opportunity to see a variety of extraordinary antiquities. The exhibition took the pupils on a 4,000-year journey from life in the ancient Mediterranean to today: many of the more than two-hundred objects from three of the largest Mediterranean islands, Cyprus, Crete, and Sardinia were on display for the first time. The exhibition enabled our Year 8 pupils to understand how these island cultures helped to shape the larger Mediterranean world with the migrations and movement of peoples and the exhibition also revealed how 'islanders' lived centuries ago. Before heading back to school, the pupils took the opportunity to view and appreciate the range of portraiture on display in the Fitzwilliam Museum, which linked to their work on portraiture from the Michaelmas term.

Junior Maths Challenge Results

We are delighted to announce the results of the Junior Maths Challenge 2023. Our pupils achieved superb results and to do so, they demonstrated their ability to reason and problem-solve at a high level. The Junior Maths Challenge encourages precision of thought and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. The problems presented



in the question paper are designed to encourage students to think laterally. This year, 27 pupils received a Gold Award; 33, a Silver Award; and 29 gained a Bronze Award.

Further congratulations go to 17 pupils who have been selected for the next round, the Junior Kangaroo, and the 3 pupils invited to the highest level, the Junior Olympiad. Nationally, around 10,000 pupils take part in the Junior Kangaroo and around 1,200 of the very highest performers are invited to take part in the Junior Maths Olympiad paper. We wish these pupils the very best of luck for the next stages.



Rotary Young Writer's Competition

This week we have also received some highly celebratory news this from the Rotary Young Writers' Competition. One of our pupils came first in the regional Intermediate age group and were subsequently entered into the East Anglia final, in which they were placed second.

Further success was enjoyed by St Faith's pupils in both the regional Junior and regional Intermediate competitions, with pupils being placed second and third in both competitions and we look forward to the pupils receiving their certificates after half-term.

Welcome to the Performing Arts Department

On Thursday afternoon, we welcomed our Year 1 & 2 parents to a 'drop-in' after school in the



Drama Studio where Pre Prep and Performing Arts staff were on hand to speak to parents and children, providing information and answering questions about the Performing Arts curriculum at St Faith's. Parents were then invited to move between various rehearsal spaces to see and hear Year 3 to 8 ensembles preparing music for the Summer Music Concert.



In the Classrooms this Week

On Thursday morning, Ms Smith's Year 7 English class enjoyed a visit from her own former English teacher, Mr Wallace. Pupils discussed what is so exciting about the study of literature and considered the evolving nature of the English language and its complicated punctuation. Mr Wallace also gave his feedback on some of the fifty-word stories which the class has written this year, which include the tale of 'The Cursed Horse'! It is hoped that Mr Wallace will return to St Faith's next year to meet the pupils again at the end of their Year 8 studies, to reflect upon and celebrate their learning.

Year 7 Pythagoras' Theorem



This week in Maths, Year 7 pupils have been proving and investigating Pythagoras' Theorem. On Monday, pupils were selecting appropriate equipment to measure the sides of tennis courts, table tennis tables and notice boards around school, and then applying their knowledge to find missing sides or diagonals. They worked collaboratively and demonstrated an impressively secure understanding of this topic. Other tasks have included investigating Pythagorean Triples and the application of Pythagoras' Theorem in 3D shapes.

War with Troy



Year 6 have been working on their 'War with Troy' projects in English. They enjoyed an inspiring session in the ICT suite producing project book covers with images based on the Greek myth stories they have been studying. From Achilles to the mysterious golden apple, Year 6 have enjoyed their immersion into the Ancient world of scheming Gods and Goddesses.

Liquids, Solids and Gases and Life Processes

As part of the Science curriculum, Year 4 have been studying Solids, Liquids & Gases. The children have enjoyed all the investigations involved in this unit, which included how to separate a mixture of solids. The children were asked to separate a mixture of small rocks, paper clips, sand and rice using a variety of equipment. They concluded that they only needed a sieve and their fingers but enjoyed using magnets, funnels and tweezers during their investigation.

Meanwhile as part of their Life Processes unit in Science, some Year 5 pupils made storyboards to summarise the lifecycle of a flowering plant. Here are some of their wonderful pieces of work.

They have been given a £5 loan from school to start a small business, either on their own or in a group, with the aim of raising as much money as possible in four weeks. On Thursday, Ashburton courtyard was transformed into a bustling marketplace as the children ran stalls to sell brownies, smoothies, cookies, popcorn and bracelets, all accompanied by busking from a guitarist, cellist and piper. The Year 8 pupils carefully planned and meticulously stocked their stalls in good advance of the event and so when breaktime came, they were delighted to have had so many happy customers. There will be another opportunity for them to run a stall at school after half term before they repay their loans and return all the profit to be donated to charity.
