National SATIPS Handwriting Competition


In the Summer Term, pupils from Years 3 – 8 took part in the National SATIPS handwriting competition with one of our pupils receiving 2nd place in their age group. In recognition of this truly excellent achievement, they were awarded a certificate in assembly at the beginning of this term.

The Lent term production for Year 6 this academic year will be the much-loved story of Beauty and the Beast. Initial rehearsals have already begun, and our Year 6 pupils are eagerly awaiting the opportunity to audition for different roles. It is certain to be a fantastic production, involving input from our whole Creative Arts team.

The Greenhouse Effect





In Year 8 Geography, pupils created a visual representation of The Greenhouse Effect using a basketball to represent the sun, and duvets of differing thickness to represent the layer of Greenhouse gases. We noted that whilst we need these gases to keep our atmosphere at a suitable temperature, the concern is the rapid increase in such gases leading to global warming.

iPad Training for Year 7 Pupils

Following a successful pilot scheme for Year 7 last year, we are delighted that this year's Year 7 pupils will also now have access to individual iPads. Our new Head of Digital Development and Apple Professional Learning Specialist, Mr Richard Poth, is committed to enhancing the learning experience for the children through technology. The introduction of iPads will provide new opportunities for interactive, creative and innovative learning experiences across the curriculum.

In addition to using iPads in Year 7, we also have class sets of iPads available in Pre Prep and



in Years 3 and 4 for use in lessons and activities. These iPads play a crucial role in our teaching and learning approach, helping to build confidence and providing students with valuable digital resources to aid their education.

Seesaw for Enhanced Communication

One of the key digital applications for both our pupils and parents from Foundation to Year 4 is Seesaw and we encourage all parents with children in these Year groups to set up a Seesaw parent account. This 'window on the classroom' will allow you to see what your child has been doing in class and is another way in which you can be involved in their educational journey. We have found it very beneficial for enhancing communication and we also hope it will enable you to understand your child's progress, as well as being able to see examples of their work and homework tasks.

Meet the Tutors and Introduction to the New School Year

Following on from similar events for other year groups last week, on Tuesday night, parents of children in Foundation and Years 4, 7 and 8 attended presentations about arrangements for the forthcoming year. These covered a range of academic and pastoral topics and were followed by refreshments in Ashburton Hall and the opportunity to meet tutors. I also very much enjoyed the opportunity to meet many of you, and I was delighted to hear how well your children are settling in to their new Year groups. Dr Bike Workshops

As one of our sustainable travel initiatives, we have hosted 'Dr Bike' workshops for staff and pupils on Tuesday and Thursday of this week. These highly popular workshops, run by skilled bicycle mechanics, ensure that bikes are safe to ride and operate. As the nights become darker and colder, may we also remind parents to ensure that pupils have suitable high visibility clothing, lights and cycle helmets for their journeys to and from school.

Academic pursuits are busily underway and I have had the pleasure of visiting lessons in a number of Year groups this week. It is clear that the children are really enjoying the exploration of new topics and being inspired by their new teachers. In Year 6, river formation was being studied in Humanities, whilst in Science, pupils were learning about evaporation and condensation. Pupils in Year 8 have been exploring the topic of the Industrial Revolution, while pupils in Year 3 have really enjoyed their visits to the library and the opportunity to choose new books to read. In Spanish, pupils are expanding their vocabulary and practising their pronunciation, as well as learning about different Spanish cities, including Barcelona and Madrid.


Asking Your Opinion
