### **Start of Term Assembly**

We began the term, and indeed the new calendar year, with our whole school assembly. Our theme was Epiphany, and we looked in detail at the famous painting 'The Adoration of the Magi' by Peter Paul Rubens, and considered what it represents. We also considered the meaning of the word 'Epiphany' and thought about lightbulb moments in our own lives. In particular, we recognised that sometimes lightbulb moments only happen when we are still and quiet, or if we have space and time to think, but that they have the power to change our lives.
