Pre Prep Mini London Marathon

This week, the Prep Prep have been learning about the benefits of keeping fit. The aim of the TCS Mini London Marathon in schools is to encourage children to be active and to understand the importance of exercise for physical and mental health. Children were invited to run, jog, walk, or wheel 2.6 miles / 26 minutes through the week, completing the Mini Marathon this Friday.

WWF-UK (the World Wide Fund for Nature) has become the inaugural charity partner of the TCS Mini London Marathon and the TCS Mini London Marathon in schools. Since the London Marathon started in 1981, its participants have raised more than £1 billion for many good causes. The Pre Prep is supporting Anthony Nolan and DKMS, two charities very close to the heart of our Pre Prep community.

New Equality, Diversity and Inclusion statement for our Foundation

Colleagues have worked together to produce our new Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) statement, which incorporates the views of the whole school community, most notably the voice of our pupils.

The Leys and St Faith's Foundation recognises and values all individuals as equal. We want every member of our school communities to feel safe and that they belong. Our aim is for everyone to feel that they are treated equitably and supported to reach their full potential.

On Monday, Mrs Davies spoke to the children about what this statement means and why it is so important to our whole Community.

At the end of last year, we carried out EDI surveys amongst our Year 3-8 pupils and the results were encouraging.

- Equality: 90% pupils agree or strongly agree that St Faith's recognises that pupils have different strengths and needs and helps everyone to do the best they can;
- Diversity: 84% pupils agree or strongly agree that they feel differences are respected at St Faith's;
- Inclusion: 90% pupils agree or strongly agree that they feel valued, respected and included at St Faith's.

We remain committed to celebrating diversity and difference through the curriculum and are delighted when pupils want to share their own experiences with us and make suggestions in support of our EDI initiatives.

National Schools Gymnastics Finals 2024



Last weekend, 14 gymnasts from St Faith's travelled to Stoke-on Trent to represent the East of England at National Schools Gym. Gymnasts qualified in Boys' Under 14 Tumbling, Boys' Under 14 Sports Acrobatics, Girls' Under 11 Sports Acrobatics, Boys' Under 11 Floor and Vault and Boys' Under 14 Floor and Vault.

On Saturday we were delighted that one of our pupils took 5th place in a very strong tumbling competition where the field numbered twelve in total. In a thrilling and very tight Sports Acrobatics competition two of our boys squeezed artfully into bronze medal position and a young but highly competent Under 11 boys' team captured silver medals. The Under 11 team comprised two Year 5 and three Year 4 pupils.

On Sunday, we witnessed our first ever female Acrobats participate in the National finals of the Women's pairs events. Not only did two of our pupils make history as our regional representatives, but it is the first time that a female pair from St Faith's has ever won any colour medal at our regional competition. The girls finished 8th in a very strong field and their scores



reflected the fact that they were definitely in the mix and acquitted themselves admirably.

The end of the day saw the fiercest of contests for our Under 14 boys. It needs to be highlighted that the Under 14 age group encompasses boys from Year 7, 8 and 9 and St Faith's can only field competitors from Years 7 and 8. The favourites and last year's winners, The Royal Grammar School, Newcastle Upon Tyne set a high standard in the first round and it quickly became apparent that they were the team to beat. Our team was made up of 1 Year 7 and 5 Year 8 pupils. The team cohesion was admirable and it is interesting to remember that all boys started competing for St Faith's as members of the Under 7 team in Year 2. They have stayed loyal to the sport and to their team for seven years.

The final result was in our favour with Cooper's Coburn and Company finishing 3rd, RGS Newcastle 2nd and St Faith's in 1st place and National Champions (by the narrowest margin of 0.3).

A moment for celebration but an opportunity to be grateful to the boys for their efforts and their parents for their unwavering support.

Thanks must also go to Mrs North, Miss Butler and Mr North for their dedication and coaching over many years, as well as to Mr Johnson and Mr Mageean for accompanying the group on their weekend of competition.
