This week, we were informed that St Faith's has been short-listed for the prestigious TES (Times Educational Supplement) Independent School Awards 2018, in two categories: 'Strategic initiative of the year' and 'Prep School of the year'. The awards recognise excellence and innovation in independent schools across the UK and abroad. The strategic education category commends initiatives in improving learning outcomes for pupils and helping them to fulfil their potential. We have been shortlisted for our introduction of Engineering. The second category, 'Prep School of the year', is applicable to schools that have experienced rapid improvement as well as for those that are maintaining continued excellence. TES state that schools shortlisted demonstrate innovation, imagination and efforts to develop children in ways that go beyond the league tables. The expert panel of judges will review the shortlisted entries and the winners will be revealed on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February at an awards ceremony in central London.
