## National Hockey Champions!

Then followed a fine win over Bishop's Stortford in the quarter final and a tense semi-final against Millfield, which our girls eventually won on penalty flicks. The final itself was against Foremarke Hall (Repton Junior School) which our girls won comfortably, 2-0. Our coaches, Mr Thompson, Mr Welch and Miss Wacey were thrilled (and also soaked to the skin) and commented, 'We are so proud of the girls. They fully deserve this title as they have such an excellent work ethic in training and superb team spirit.' I would like to congratulate the girls on this fantastic achievement and thank our brilliant hockey coaching staff for guiding our players to another national title. It is remarkable that in Year 7, both our boys' and girls' teams are the current national hockey champions.
