Later in the day, Anup performed alongside our Senior String Orchestra, Junior Strings and Pre Prep Strings groups with parents joining in. This was followed by a curry fundraiser organised by Ms Overman. I am delighted to inform you that £626 was raised through the event which will be used to fund new buildings at the Mathieson Music School.
