



The 'Move Up' morning on Thursday was very exciting. The children explored their new classrooms and returned to Foundation later in the morning excited and feeling particularly grown-up! We hope that you were able to meet your child's Year 1 teacher on the afternoon of 21st June.

For the rest of the week the children have been working as normal. They have been writing a recount of our trip to South Angle Farm and many of them wrote about holding the spider and feeding the lambs. We have also been around the school on a pollution survey where the children found a few bits of plastic that had been dropped!

In Maths this week, the children have focused on measuring. They have been measuring mass and length using non-standard units.

For homework, we would like the children to think about this problem. Show the children the picture and tell them: These drawings were found in La Pileta cave in Spain and could be up to 25000 years old.



Ask them:

- What do you think these drawings represent?
- Could they be about counting things?
- What might 'stone-age' people count?
- Might they be the earliest known number patterns?
- Could you try and make up your own way of recording counting?

On Friday 29th June, the Foundation children will have another opportunity to spend time in their Year 1 classrooms. This time spent in Year 1 is an important part of your child's transition and will help support them when they make the move in September.
