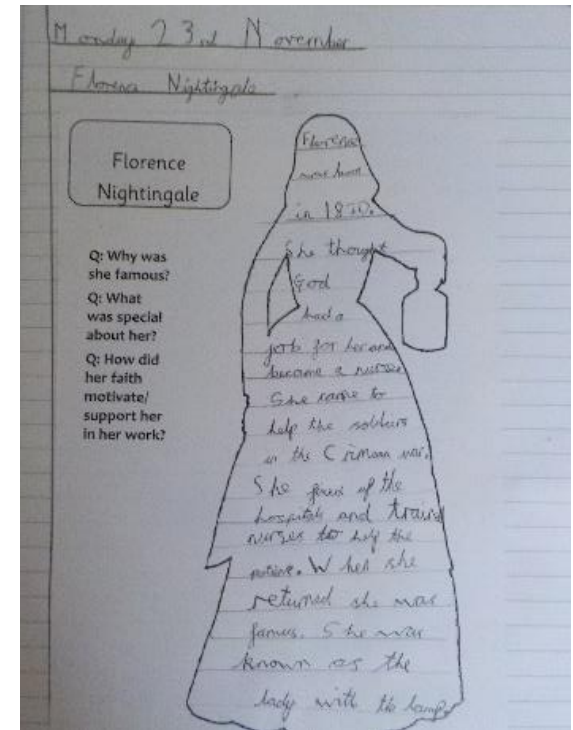
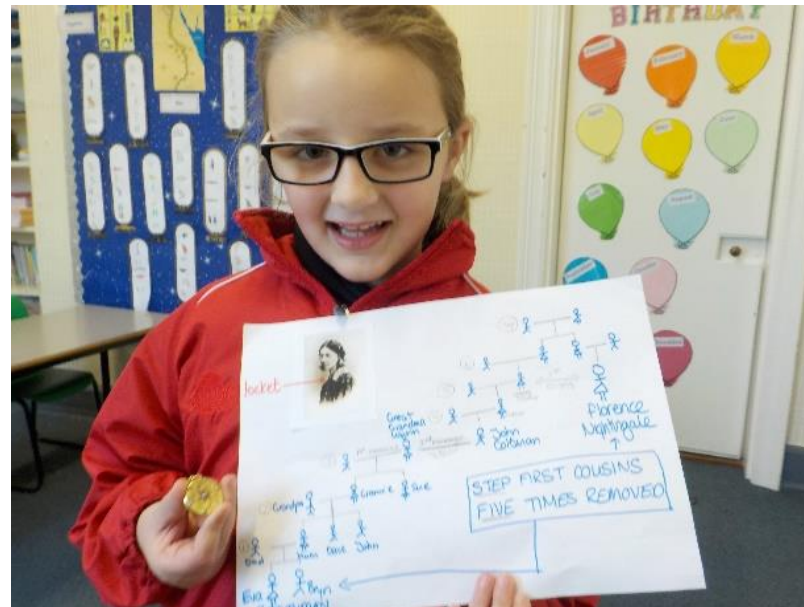


Year 3 Humanities
