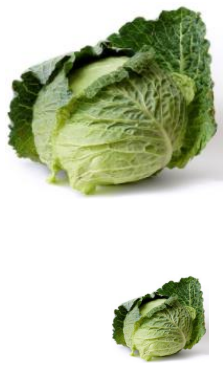


The Strike of Grass by Sam Batra

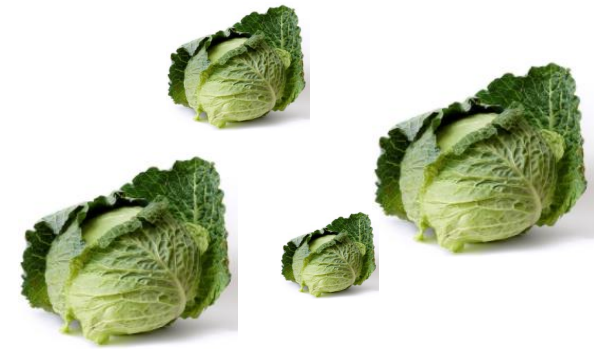
