This week in Maths the children have been thinking about odd and even numbers. They have been busy exploring the fact that odd numbers cannot be shared equally between two, because there is an 'odd one out' left over. In order to support this learning at home, you could try and solve this problem:

**Pat has no more than 10 sweets in a bag.**



**She counts her sweets in groups of two. She has one left over.**

**How many sweets could Pat have? Is there another answer?**

Next week we are looking at the Global Goal 5 – gender equality. We will be looking at the work of Coco Chanel. Our word of the week will be 'equality'.
