Anti-Bullying Alliance's Definition:

The **repetitive, intentional hurting** of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an **imbalance of power**. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological.

It can happen face to face or online.





## WHAT IS RESPECT?

Oxford Languages definition:

**Have due regard for (someone's feelings, wishes, or rights).**

**Fair – treating others as you would expect to be treated**

**Forgiving - helping to keep the peace**

**Kind - thinking of others ahead of ourselves**
